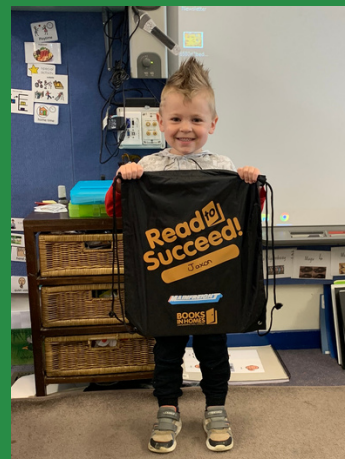

STAYING IN TOUCH WITH MS LEWIS

We have arrived at Week 10 of Term 3! What a year we have had. This term has seen our Kindergarten students attending for the full 10 weeks of the term – they haven't been able to do this due to COVID impacting on our first 2 terms.

COVID Restrictions Continue: COVID-19 school related restrictions still remain valid and are still in place. This includes parents/carers not being permitted on-site at school. Any visitors entering our school site, including parents who enter school grounds to go to the front office on important business must complete the Department of Education's 'External Visitor to School Site' form every time they set foot on school grounds. Please stay in contact with our school via telephone and email during this time.

Check-in Assessments: In the absence of NAPLAN testing this year, Years 3 and 5 participated in Check-in Assessments developed by the Department of Education. This data will be triangulated with our other data to provide a snapshot of where our students in Years 3 and 5 are sitting in relation to the state average. This data will also give a clearer picture of individual student performance and provide feedback for consideration when writing the new school improvement plan.

Tell Them from Me surveys: All students from Year 4 to Year 6 have completed the Tell Them from Me surveys and each class has completed our PAT – Social and Emotional Checklist. This gives us feedback on the overall wellbeing of students and their relationships with their peers and staff.

This will provide us with valuable feedback to inform our planning over the coming years as we develop our new School Improvement Plan. 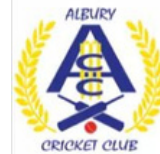
