NAPLAN Term 2 Week 3

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual national assessment for all students in Years 3, 5, 7, and 9. All students in these year levels are expected to participate in these tests. Our students will complete four tests – writing, reading, language and numeracy, beginning tomorrow, 10 May, and finishing next Tuesday, 17 May. These tests are all online, except for the Year 3 Writing, which will be on paper. Any students who miss a test will do catch-up tests.

Covid Guidelines:

The isolation requirements for close contacts have changed meaning that now students and staff can return to school as long as they have no symptoms, complete a daily rapid antigen test (RAT) and wear a mask indoors. We are getting additional supplies of RATS this week so please contact the school if you would like any sent home.

With the flu season fast approaching and COVID still impacting our school community, we ask that parents/carers follow the guidelines:

- Keep children at home if they are displaying COVID-19/flu-like symptoms – do not send children to school if they are unwell – even if they have tested negative.

Health advice is that students who are sick, should stay at home and recover, avoiding putting other students and staff at risk of getting sick.

- Test if you have symptoms using Rapid Antigen Test (RAT's) – additional RAT's will be made available to families with the next 2 weeks.
- Keep up to date with your Vaccinations.
